FELINE INFLUENZA

Cat tests positive for influenza A (H7N2)
Dr. Newbury comes to NYC at request of Dr. Brennen

ASPCA
Quarantine facility selected and set-up within 5 days

Over 450 cats transferred from all ACC Care Centers to Long Island City Facility

Resumed in-shelter cat intake

Cats with existing medical conditions remain in quarantine for treatment

DECEMBER

JANUARY

Further tests conducted by UWSM reveal 45 cats with same virus-no evidence of infection in dogs or rabbits

Cat adoptions suspended / cat intake processed through New Hope diversion plan

Deep clean of all care centers/adoption vehicles and field fleet

Medically cleared cats begin to be transferred to adopters, partners and fosters

Quarantine Facility closure TBD

New PPE protocols put in place for all staff



FELINE INFLUENZA

FAQ

- First documented case of influenza A (H7N2) virus infection in cats
- H7N2 very contagious among cats but not fatal
- Risk to humans is low
- Comprehensive communication plan notified all potentially affected groups/individuals
- Volunteers
 - 198 volunteer hours in total
 - 13 volunteers have participated at least once

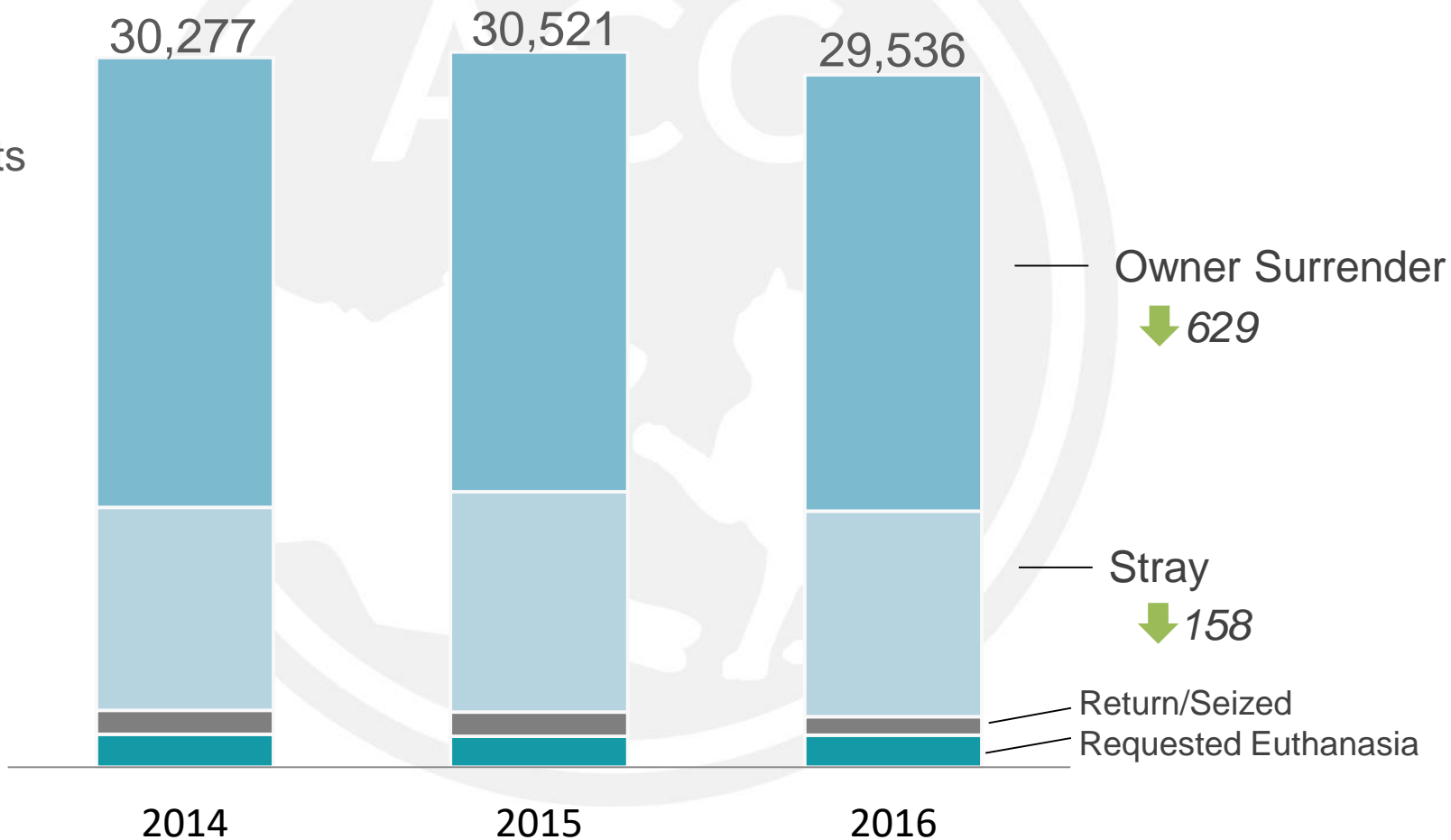

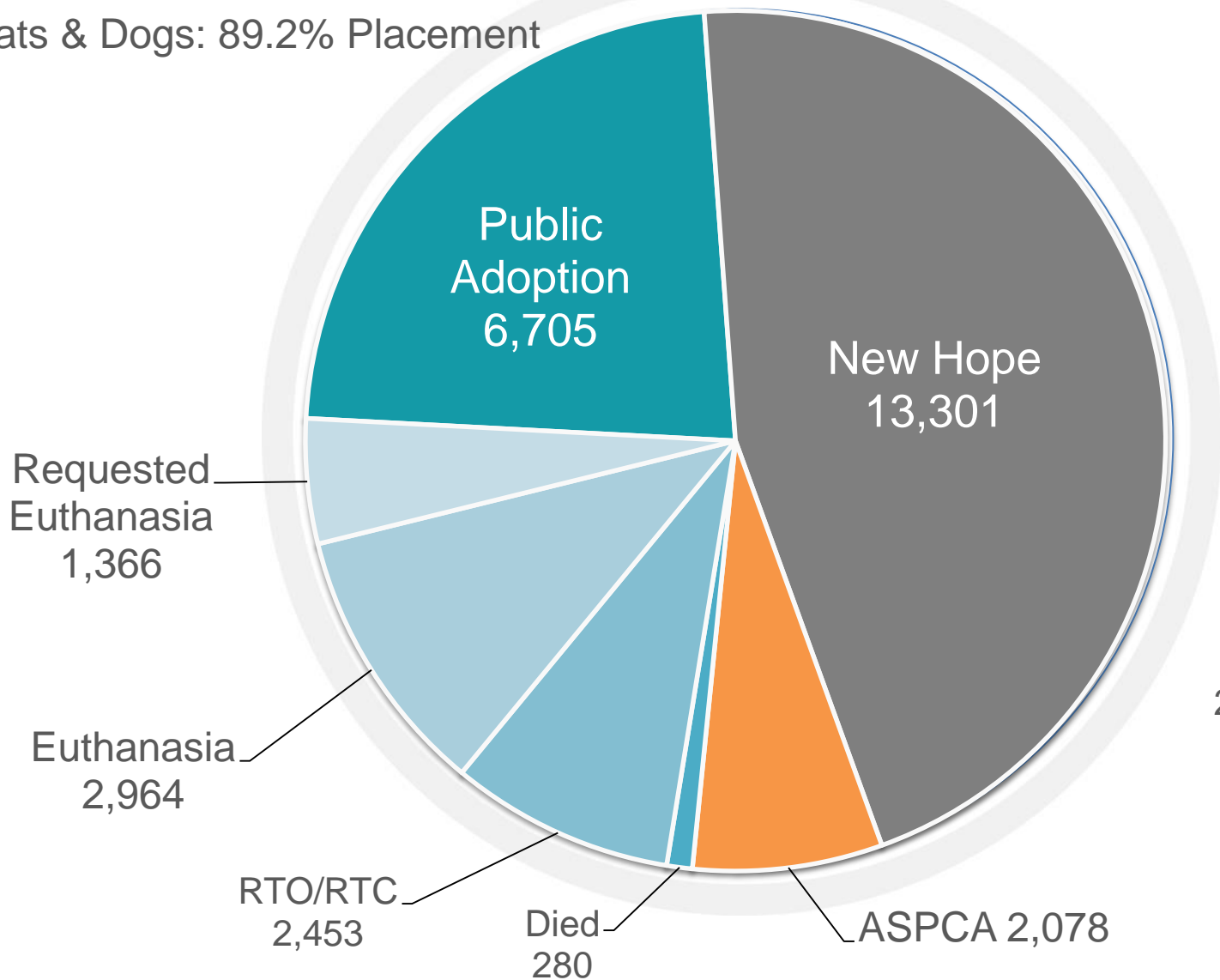

Cats & Dogs: 89.2% Placement

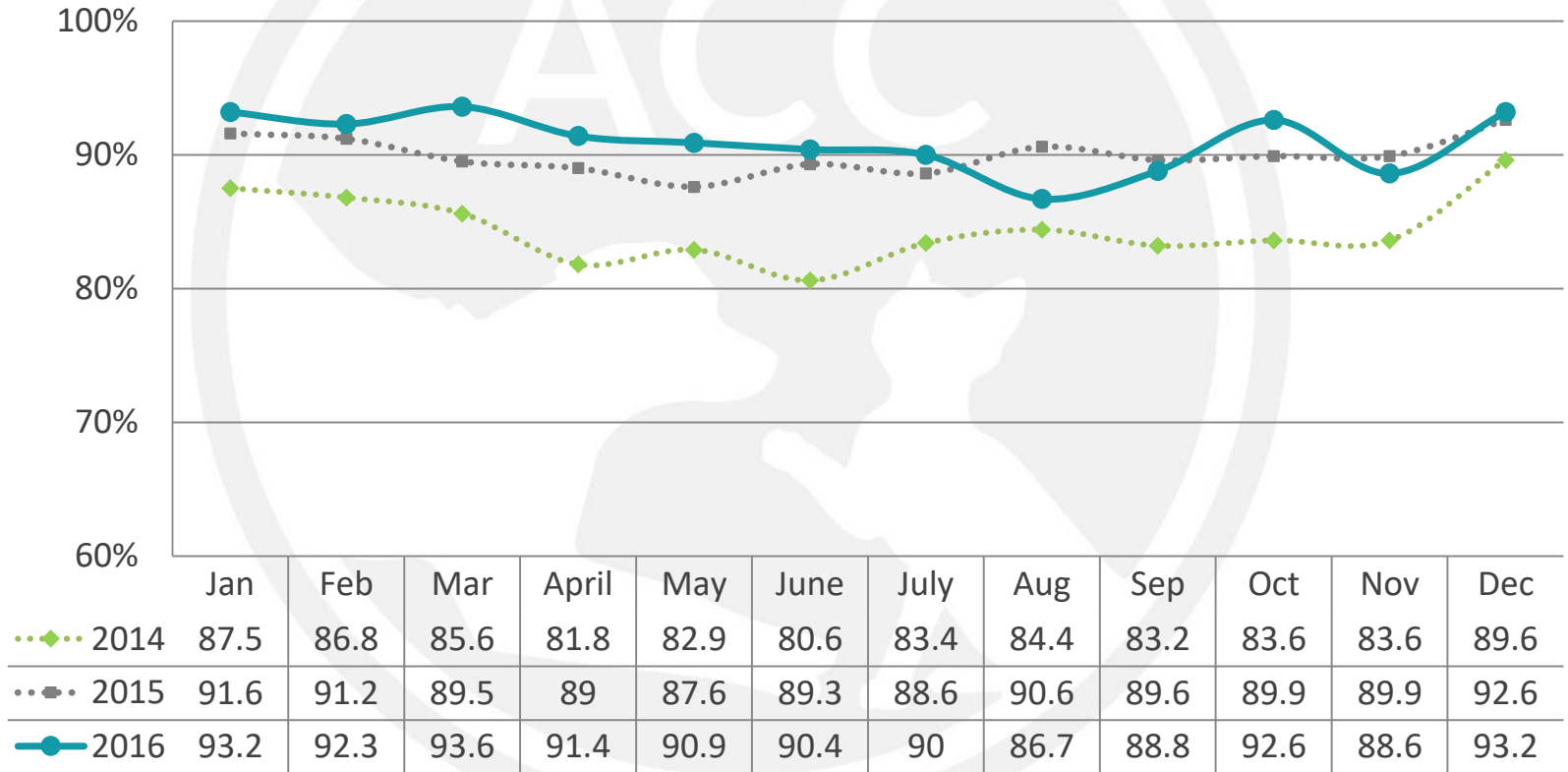

Placement Rate

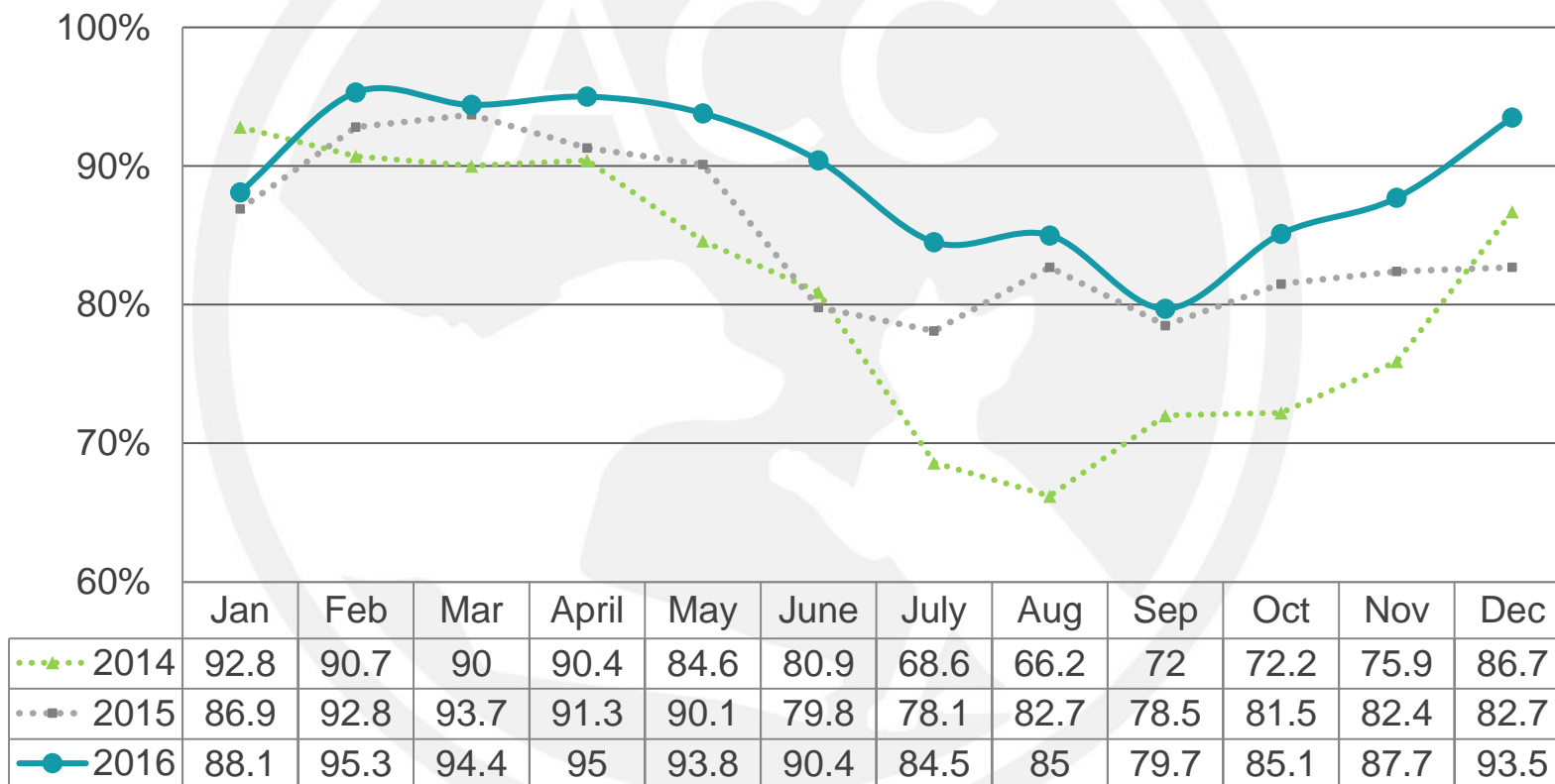

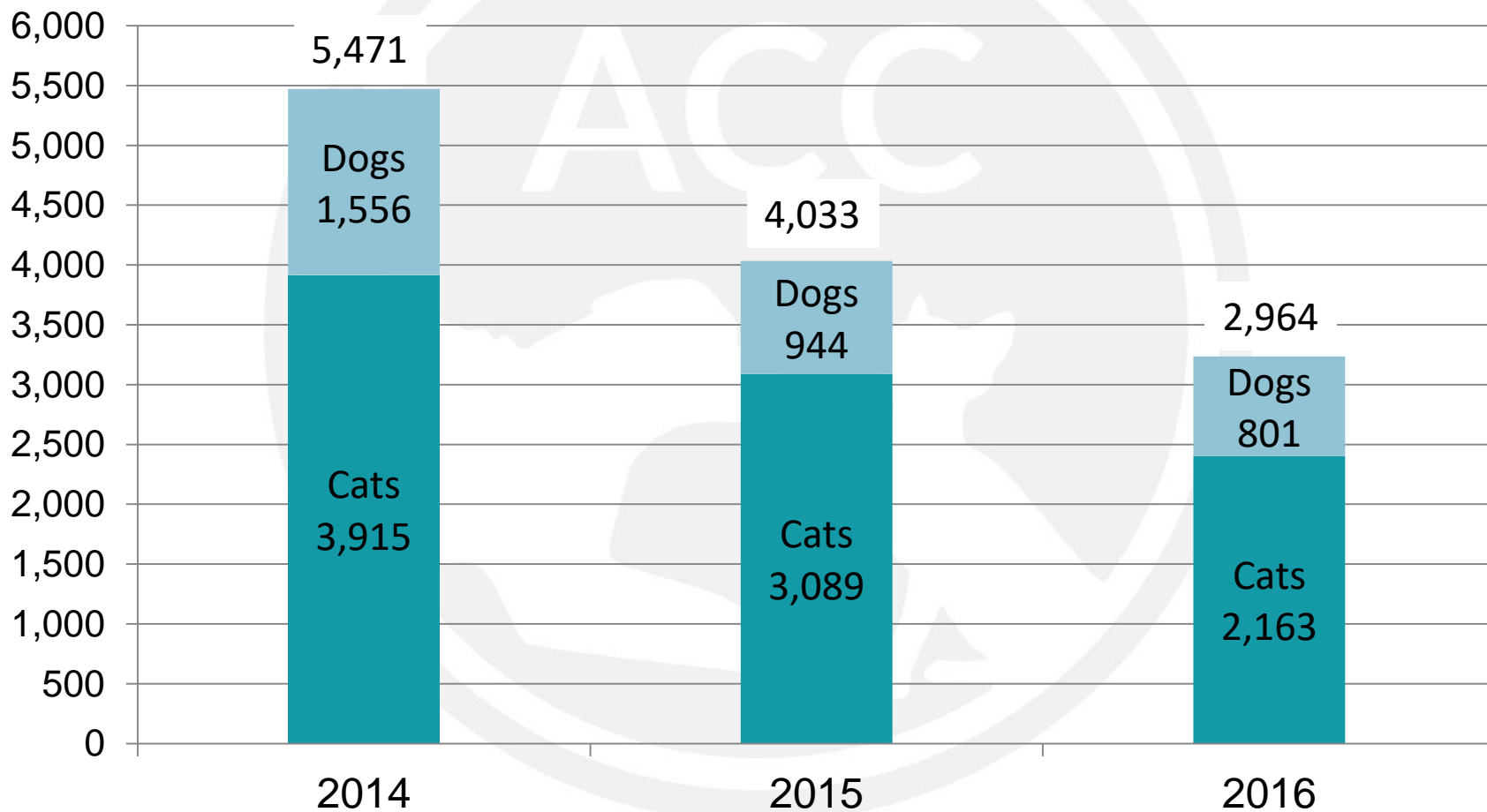

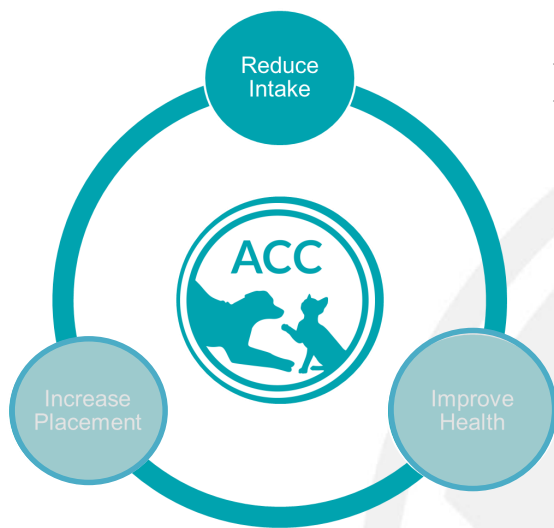




EUTHANASIA AT LOWEST IN HISTORY







➤ Community Pets Program

- 958 Animals Vaccinated
- 150 Spay/Neuter Appointments with ASPCA
- Food pantry feeds 441 pets on on-going basis
- 50 dogs taken behavior training class

➤ Surrender Prevention:

- **1,731 pets assisted**

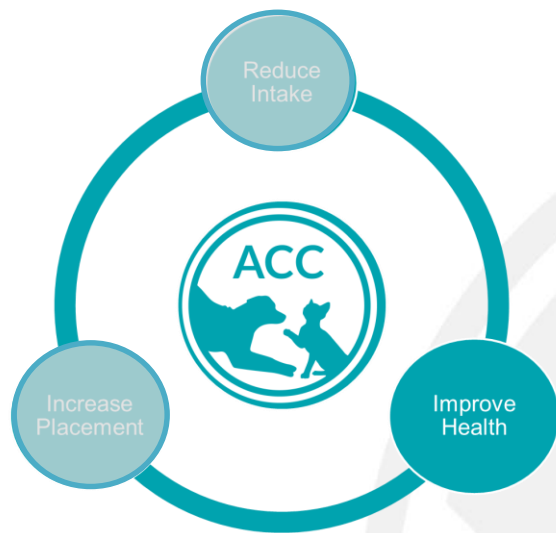
Top reasons for owner surrenders

➤ Partnerships

- New Hope Partners: 27 added
- Foster Program: 1,478 animals in 620 homes
- Volunteer Program: 42,000 hours logged

➤ Adoption Programs

- “Fast-Track” animals that are medically and behaviorally sound go straight into adoptions
- “Open Selection” allows medically and behaviorally healthy animals to be viewed for adoption during their legal/stray hold (cats benefit the most)
